Why do we need to be Order-Discoverers?

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters...God saw all that he had made, and it was very good."

- Genesis 1:1-2, 31

Throughout the process of creation, God proved to be the first and ultimate artist. He took something that was void - a blank canvas - and with care and attention He created something that He loved and saw as beautiful. Through the seven days of creation, we see God as a creator who highly values order and beauty. We see His emphasis on order even with the way that He specifically 'did' creation; He created the 'environments' first and then He filled them. Each day of creation was dependent on a day that preceded it; order mattered. During the time of creation, God took into consideration where to place the Earth at just the right place, where each star would reside and how each flower would take root. He cared deeply for all of the details; big and small.
