

<u>Mission</u>

Our mission is to prepare God's children for a life of learning and service in His world. By the grace of God, in partnership with the Christian home and church, we will lead children to be the best they can be for His glory.

<u>Vision</u>

Principles

The basic purposes and objectives of the Association for Christian Schooling in Calgary South are:

- To create an interdenominational educational community that seeks to educate the child from a Christian perspective
- To educate the whole child; challenging each student to reach their full potential in every area of personal development -- emotional, physical, social, intellectual and spiritual -- while nurturing their relationship to God in each of these areas
- To develop intellectual discipline, a keenness for knowledge and sharpness for critical thinking
- To integrate in a meaningful way what students learn at school with the home, the church, and the greater school community
- To foster Christian community and active participation among parents, staff and students
- To promote excellence in teaching through ongoing support and professional development

<u>School Goal 1</u>

TCS will endeavour to intentionally enhance teaching practice to create opportunities that support numeracy and literacy through differentiation

<u>Strategy</u>

- To assign EAs to different teachers throughout the day to allow for workshops and groupings that allow teachers to meet unique needs and close gaps in learning
- 2) Provide PD and teacher sharing opportunities to encourage collaboration, and support what is already successful in our school
- Creating opportunities for smaller group workshop scenarios to address more specific learner needs and provide more frequent formative assessment
- 4) Use varied learning resources and instructional strategies to meet different learners (ie. visual, kinesthetic, tactile, auditory)

- 1) Evidence of student success (engagement, innovation, critical thinking, articulated output) through self-reflection, self-evaluation, and varied communication (written/oral)
- 2) Teachers will report an increase in success with less need for accommodations and modifications for few, but will more accurately meet learner needs globally
- 3) Teachers will have evidence of varied formative assessments tools
- 4) Evidence of movement, varied resources, collaboration, and unique learning spaces (i.e drama room, gym, Commons)
- 5) Teachers will have evidence of Project Based Learning and examples of differentiation and extension

School Goal 1 con't...

TCS will endeavour to intentionally enhance teaching practice to create opportunities that support numeracy and literacy through differentiation

Strategy con't...

- 5) Use break out spaces and quiet work rooms so students can work with peers that support their learning style
- 6) Create groupings according to a variety of learner needs as a whole as opposed to grades or homerooms
- Educate students on their own individual learning style and encourage them to advocate to access those learning strategies

Deep Hope

Ultimately, we desire for students to be able to consistently demonstrate evidence of deeper exploration, discovery, extension and innovation to prepare them for a purpose driven future.

School Goal 2

Strategy 1 - Student Awareness

- Students will receive direct instruction intended to increase mental health awareness
 - a) Health Curriculum (Fourth R JH)
 - b) I Am Bible Curriculum
 - c) Community partnerships and speakers
 - d) Digital Citizenship Curriculum (appropriate use)
 - e) Eagles Leadership Team
 - i) Healthy eating, rest, and tech guidelines
- Students will be made aware of and given opportunities to use the supports that are available at TCS to improve their mental health
 - a) FSLC Councillor visibility/collaboration
 - b) Calm / community Rooms
 - c) Outdoor Classrooms
 - d) Therapy Dogs

- Student Ourschool Survey questions will be directed towards mental health goals, and will reflect an increase in student mental health awareness
- 2) Accountability Pillars will reflect an increase in "safe and caring" environment questions
- 3) Teachers will have evidence of mental health lessons and assignments
- 4) Visible increase in the use of therapy dogs, calm rooms, outdoor spaces throughout the school year

School Goal 2

Strategy 2 - Parent Awareness

- 1) Parents will be provided with information and resources to help them support the mental health of their child
 - a) Introduce Family School Liaison Counsellor
 - b) AHS workshops emailed home monthly
 - c) School council sponsored speakers
 - d) Prayer group
- 2) Parents will receive support from the school intended to help their students in making positive mental health choices
 - a) Healthy eating guidelines
 - b) Healthy technology use guidelines
 - c) Healthy rest guidelines

- 1) Parent and student ourschool survey questions will be directed towards mental health goals, and will reflect an increase in student and parent mental health awareness
- 2) Accountability Pillars will reflect an increase in "safe and caring" environment questions
- 3) The school will have documented evidence of resources sent to parents (guidelines and AHS trainings)
- The school will have documented evidence of guest speakers and topics sponsored through the school council

School Goal 2

T.C.S will endeavor to positively impact our community's mental health through increasing awareness and encouraging positive choices

Strategy 3 - Teacher Awareness

- 1) Teachers will be provided with information and resources to help them support their mental health
 - a) Mental Health will be a staff meeting agenda item each month
 - b) School to bring in Mental Health guest speakers during PD.
 - c) School will share information about health services available to teachers through ASEBP
 - d) Intentionally creating time margins for teachers to meet their teacher responsibilities (ie. teacher relief times)
 - e) Creating opportunities and supports for teachers to feel appreciated and affirmed (ASEBP service availability)
 - f) School will create multiple community building opportunities

- 1) Staff meeting minutes will reflect mental health discussions as a standing item
- 2) P.D. schedule will reflect the names of mental health speakers throughout the year
- 3) Teachers are able to provide examples of positive team building experiences from throughout the year
- 4) Teachers will be able to provide examples of when and how they are being appreciated and supported
